

DO YOU FACE SAFETY AND HEALTH HAZARDS ON THE JOB?

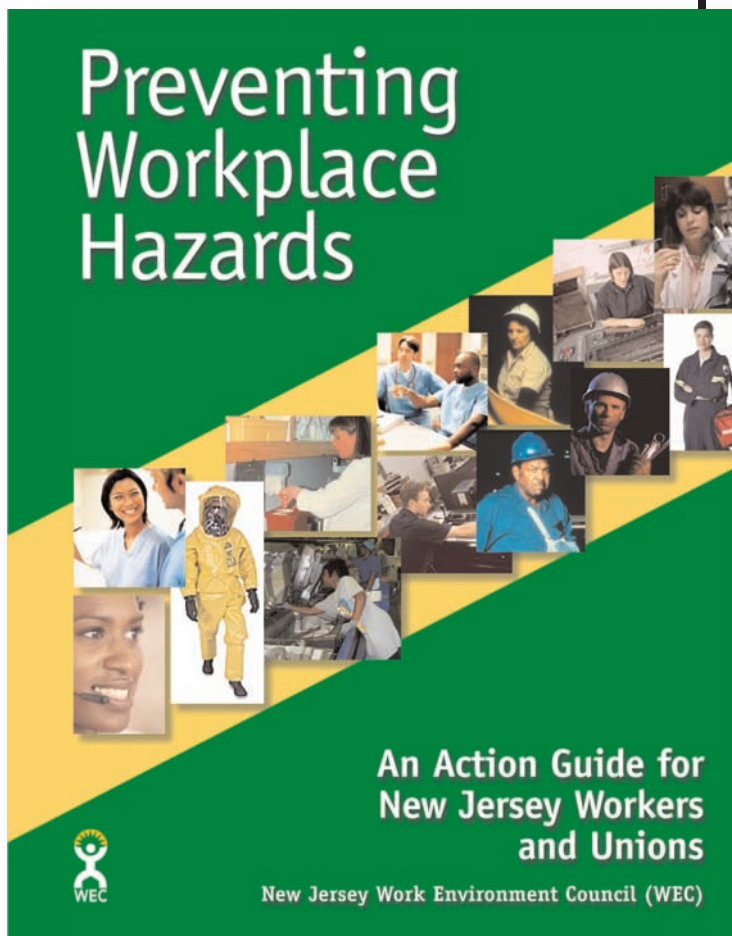
The New Jersey Work Environment Council can provide you with three valuable publications to help win safer workplaces.
